Please help your child learn and remember the Teddy Bear Teddy Bear rhyme. To extend your child's learning, you may choose to do the following activity;

Developmental Area: fine motor, counting and number recognition.

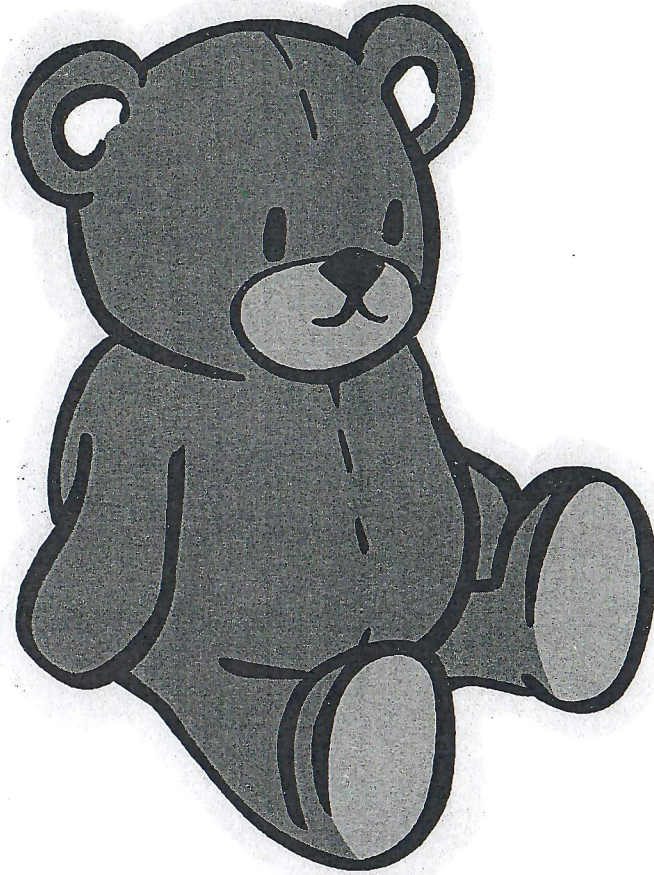
Instructions

This fine motor activity is supported by dotting or coloring and dice rolling. Also, it helps children learn to count one-to-one by matching the dots on the dice to the numbered bears; as well as number recognition. Start with numbered bears one through six. When your child matches the dice number to the bear, she/he can paint a dot on the number with a dot paint bottle. Or, she/he can make a dot with a crayon, or color the bear. Only if your child easily completes bears 1-6 and is ready, move up to the numbers seven through twelve.

Items needed:

- Print outs of numbered bears
- 1 or 2 dice depending on child's readiness
- Crayons
- Dot Art Paint (optional)

Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear

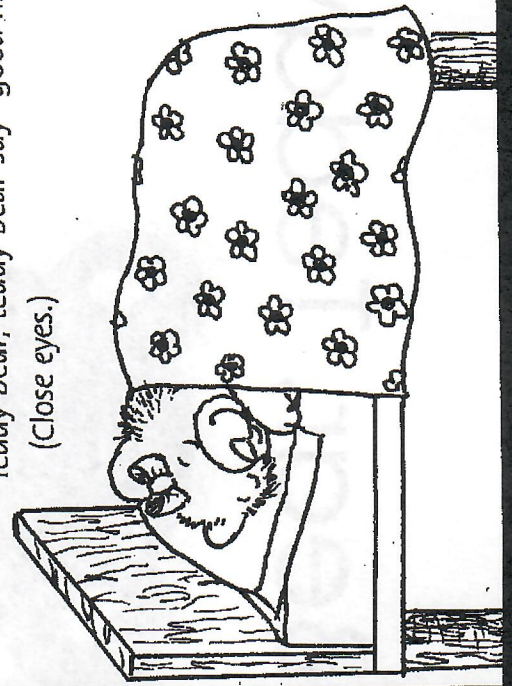


TEDDY BEAR, TEDDY BEAR

(Stand on tiptoes and stretch.)

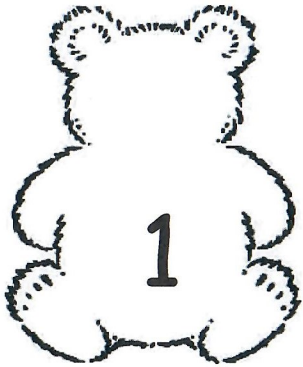
Teddy bear, teddy bear turn out the light.
